

TOWNSHIP OF COLTS NECK
BOARD OF HEALTH
March 7, 2006 Meeting Minutes

Mr. Schatzle called the Colts Neck Board of Health meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. and read the following statement: "As Chairman and Presiding Officer of this meeting of the Board of Health, I hereby declare that the notice requirements of the law have been satisfied by prominently posting on the Township bulletin board a notice of this meeting, and that there has been transmitted by regular mail a notice to the Asbury Park Press and that a copy is on file in the Office of the Township Clerk. I further order that this public announcement be placed in the minutes of this meeting."

ROLL CALL INDICATED:

PRESENT: Mesdames Flood, Iacono and Sauter, and Messrs Delle Donne, Faistl and Schatzle

ABSENT: Mesdames Boak

ALSO PRESENT: Messrs Forester and Mesdame Leininger

Dr. Faistl made a motion to approve the January 3, 2006 meeting minutes as amended and this was seconded by Liz Iacono and unanimously carried.

New Business was discussed – the geese. Chairman Schatzle explained that over the past several years the Township has entered into a cooperative services agreement with the U.S.D.A. The town is entering into the same agreement this year, eggs will be addled and geese will be culled as needed. It was noted that last year no geese were culled. The Chairman opened the public hearing for comments. There were no comments and the public hearing was closed. A motion was made by Frank Delle Donne and seconded by Liz Iacono to renew both the permit and contract with the US.D.A. to addle eggs and cull Canada Geese for 2006 and unanimously carried.

The Board of Education is constructing a new bus garage on Township property. A motion was made by Liz Iacono and seconded by Donna Flood to waive the fees for the septic and well permit fees and unanimously carried.

Health Officers Report – Mr. McBride was not in attendance.

Liaison Report – Mr. Forester stated that the Township Committee is 100% in favor of the geese program.

Dr. Faistl inquired if the septic education program for the new recreation building has been moving forward. It was noted that Mr. McBride has been talking to a Boy Scout who is checking into the feasibility of using it as an Eagle Project.

Chairman Schatzle inquired if the Board would be interested in dedicating a tree to former Chairman Larry Harris with the Shade Tree Commission's memorial tree program. The Board thought this was a wonderful idea and Liz Iacono agreed to be the liaison for this.

A motion to adjourn was made by Frank Delle Donne at 7:45 p.m. and seconded by Regina Sauter and unanimously carried. The next scheduled meeting is April 4, 2006.
