4. **DISCUSSION:** (FOR POSSIBLE INTRODUCTION) AN ORDINANCE OF COLTS NECK TOWNSHIP IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH AND THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 164, PEACE AND GOOD ORDER, ARTICLE I, §9, ENTITLED, "LOITERING" OF THE CODE OF COLTS NECK. Mr. Bartolomeo stated this ordinance was brought up through Long Range Planning and amends the current ordinance to provide clear definitions and standards regarding loitering to assist the general public and enforcement efforts. Counsel Bennett stated this ordinance prohibits a person in a public place from creating a danger to breaching the peace; creating a disturbance or annoyance to the comfort of any person; obstructing the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles; obstruct, molest or interfere with any person lawfully in a public place; and throwing of stones, snowballs or other object at any person or vehicle. With the unanimous consent of the Township Committee, Mayor Orgo read this ordinance by title at first reading and Ordinance No. 2019-13 was assigned. Mayor Orgo called for a motion. Mr. Bartolomeo made a motion to approve, seconded by Mr. Rizzuto and unanimously carried. Mayor Orgo set the public hearing June 12, 2019.

6. **ORDINANCE 2019-10:** ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING ORDINANCE 2018-8 (WHICH PROVIDED FOR VARIOUS 2018 GENERAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS) HERETOFORE FINALLY ADOPTED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF COLTS NECK TOWNSHIP, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, ON MAY 9, 2018 TO AMEND THE DESCRIPTION, INCREASE THE APPROPRIATION BY \$440,000 (INCLUDING AN ADDITIONAL GRANT FROM THE NEW JERSEY

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$290,000) AND TO INCREASE THE AUTHORIZATION OF BONDS OR NOTES BY \$432,857 was read by title at second reading by Mayor Orgo. **ADMINISTERING THE OATH OF OFFICE:** Mr. Rizzuto, Liaison to the Historical Preservation Committee, administered the Oath of Office to Ms. Connie Wilson, noting Ms. Wilson was previously a member of the Historical Preservation Committee and welcomed her return.

## 12. **ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT**

Ms. Capristo advised the annual Clean Up Day went smoothly. There were 125 curbside collections for Township seniors this year versus 133 last year. This year's collection took two days, while last year's collection took over two weeks and is a testament to the hard work and dedication of our DPW staff. Ms. Capristo thanked Lou, Gus, Kenny, Mike, Ed and Jeanie, for working together to provide this service to our senior residents. Ms. Capristo gave thanks to the Borough of Highlands, who provided a trash truck free of charge to assist with curbside collection.

Ms. Capristo reported JCP&L, through their contractor, Davy Tree Service is conducting tree trimming and overhead removal in the Township, beginning June 3 and continuing throughout the summer months.

The Township received a Clean Communities Grant in the amount of \$38,763, which is an increase of approximately \$4,000 over last year's grant. These monies are used to support the Township's volunteer and paid cleanup projects and to purchase litter collection equipment.

The 2019 Road Improvement Project is underway. Three cul de sacs (Applethorn, Evergreen and Talleyrand) were completed and Millpond, Heyers Mill and Cedar Drive will be underway shortly. The County will be doing drainage repair work on Cedar Drive, and approximately 100 feet will be paved after the County completes this work. The millings from these projects are being delivered to Bucks Mill Park to be used for the new parking area.

Ms. Capristo reported the bid for the Pole Barn was advertised May 20, with a bid opening June 6, 2019 and an award at the June 12 Township Committee meeting.

Ms. Capristo advised the building committee has completed approximately 95% of the plan to renovate the Bucks Mill Park Block Building. The Notice to Bidders is anticipated June 11, with a bid opening July 2 and an award of contract projected for the July 10 Township Committee meeting.

**14. TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

Mr. Viola reported the Cedar Drive in-service training will address student vaping.

Mr. Viola noted the Township's participation in the National Night Out August 6, is being handled by Sergeant Caswell and Officer Capriotti and new ideas are being presented this year. Mr. Viola commented this is a good opportunity for residents to get to meet the emergency services members within the community.

Mr. Viola commented on the Memorial Day Parade noting everyone stepped up at this community event, and he thanked the coordinating efforts of the Recreation and Parks Department and the Recreation Committee and all those participating that made it memorable. Mr. Viola gave thanks to the Ryan family, who cooked 1,200 hot dogs for the picnic and many thanks to the Michos family for donating the hot dogs for this event.

Mr. Rizzuto reported the building committee met with the contractor Griffin & Son, and he is very impressed as the observations and recommendations should result in saving the Township money in the long run. Mr. Rizzuto thanked Ms. Capristo for finding the right person for this job.

Mr. Rizzuto advised the Executive Fire Council met and is working on ordinance updates.

Mr. Rizzuto reported several applications were reviewed by the Architectural Review Committee during the last meeting.

Mr. Rizzuto noted Mr. Garret Thompson, a member of the Conover family, accompanied the Historical Preservation Committee members to the marker placement ceremony at 100 Conover Road recently. Mr. Thompson has been a member of the Colts Neck Fire Department for 76 years and will soon reach the age of 100. Mr. Rizzuto advised there is a new sign project underway for the entry signs at the Township's border.

Mr. Rizzuto spoke of the programs at the Library, including the Spelling Bee, the Summer Reading Program, and the class trip to the Library during which the students crafted and each received a Library card. Mr. Rizzuto noted the landscaping at the front of the Library has been cleaned up and mulched and looks much better.

Mr. Macnow reported COAH is at the brink of resolution; however, the Township has no control over when it will be resolved. Mr. Macnow is hopeful to schedule a public meeting for September.

Mr. Macnow advised the plaque for Duncan Thecker was installed at the all purpose field within Five Point Park. Mr. Macnow noted Mr. Thecker gave a lot to the Township, in service to the community as well as the financial contribution that made the dreams of having an all purpose field a reality.

Mr. Macnow noted this was his last Memorial Day Parade participating as a Township Committeeman. He advised 40 homes were sold in town, and younger families are coming forward to participate in events offered by the Township. He noted last year only 5 children participated in the bicycle decorating contest, whereas this year there were 27 participants.

Mr. Bartolomeo advised a resident who is a professional in the business wants to build and donate a steel pedestal on which to place the stone commemorating Duncan Thecker at the all purpose field. Township Committee is in unanimous agreement to accept the donation and schedule a formal unveiling of the stone. Township Committee is also in unanimous agreement of the proposed Sports Foundation paver project at the all purpose field.

Mr. Bartolomeo reminded residents they must use the "Report a Concern" portal on the Township's website to report properties that need attention and clean up. He noted there is a process and the Township is going through the process to ensure the properties are cleaned up.

Mr. Bartolomeo commented the schools and churches have increased enrollments of young families coming to town. He noted local businesses are concerned about the change in the business district to one of mixed use. Mr. Macnow commented, on a macro level, with more people in town more business will be generated for local businesses. Mr. Bartolomeo reported the Colts Neck Police Department was the recent winner at the tractor pull held at Delicious Orchards. Mr. Bartolomeo noted business owners want to participate in the Christmas holiday weekend.

Mr. Bartolomeo stated Recreation Committee Chair John Cantalupo was the driving force in getting the message out about the Memorial Day Parade. Mr. Bartolomeo stated this was the best marched parade; however, more spectators are needed. Improvements for next year's parade are in the works.

Mr. Bartolomeo reported June 14 will be “movie in the park” to be held at Town Hall Park at the pond-side lawn. On June 16, the “fishing derby” will be held at Bucks Mill Park. Details for these and other Township-sponsored events are on the Township’s website.

Mayor Orgo thanked Col. James Sfayer for his contribution to the Memorial Day Program. Mayor Orgo noted the flag flown at the Firehouse was gifted to Garret Thompson, the Parade’s Grand Marshall. Ten Colts Neck veterans attended, and there will be outreach to have younger Veterans participate in the future. Mr. Rizzuto thanked the entire Fire House #2 for their hospitality in hosting the Parade activities.

Mayor Orgo noted Long Range Planning will be developing more ordinances for Township Committee review and approval.

**15. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC**

Hearing no further comments, Mayor Orgo called for a motion to open the meeting to public comments. Mr. Macnow made a motion, seconded by Mr. Rizzuto and unanimously carried by voice vote.

Mr. Alan Ryan, resident, thanked the Veterans, living and deceased, for ensuring our freedom. He also thanked Tom Michos for providing the hot dogs, rolls, and condiments, as well as Mary Pahira for providing the birch beer, and for Trony Clifton and the Scouts for painting the flag pole. He also thanked the Recreation and Parks staff, John Cantalupo, Joe Mancino, Jim Sarinelo and David Mann for all they did to prepare the Fire House for this year’s Memorial Day Parade.

Mr. Fulton Wilcox, resident, spoke about the deliberative processes for the pole barn, the repurposed block building, the Police/Court building and questioned why the site next to the Library was not chosen for the Police/Court building. Counsel Bennett, Mr. Bartolomeo and Mr. Macnow spoke of the deliberative processes these past four years. Mr. Wilcox was advised the Township Committee is elected by its residents to deliberate just these types of decisions, as all legislators do. The Township Committee is being guided by licensed experts and noted Mr. Wilcox is not a licensed professional within this State. The Township takes all comments received under consideration, and continues to deliberate. Mr. Wilcox then asked what debt is being retired. He was advised to contact Mr. Antonides.

Mr. David Mann, resident, questioned why the DEP would not approve the relocation to the space adjacent to the Library. Counsel Bennett advised for every acre utilized, the Township would have to designate 20 acres as Green Acres property. The 20/1 land swap as well as the need for additional parking area made this location not feasible.

Ms. Elaine Mann, resident, questioned Resolution 2019-88 to change the purpose at Bucks Mill Park. Ms. Mann was advised Green Acres has already approved the change of purpose. Ms. Mann questioned the amount of staff needed for curbside collection for Clean Up Day this year. She was advised the first day, 5 workers were utilized, and the second day 4 workers were utilized, and the Township only utilized a trash truck from the Highlands, not their workers. The time spent is two weeks collection last year versus two days this year. Ms. Mann questioned the bid process and are bids opened publicly. Mr. Macnow provided Ms. Mann with a summary of the bid process of the local public contracts law under which the Township operates. Ms. Mann questioned if staff was hired to pick up leaves and brush, the answer was no. Ms. Mann stated the mulch around the buildings looks great.

Ms. Judy Laufer, resident, stated Garret Thompson is a great individual and one she has known for a long time, as he was her first letter carrier. Ms. Laufer stated he is a gentleman and a person that is a pleasure to spend time with in conversation.

Ms. Sue Fitzpatrick, resident and CNBA past President, stated the CNBA was happy to participate in the Parade and the tractor pull. Ms. Fitzpatrick stated she will miss Clerk Kara, and wishes her luck.

Hearing no further comments, Mayor Orgo called for a motion to close the meeting to public comments. Mr. Bartolomeo made a motion, seconded by Mr. Rizzuto and unanimously carried by voice vote.

16. **RESOLUTION 2019-98:** EXECUTIVE SESSION was read by title by Mayor Orgo, who then called for a motion. Mr. Rizzuto made a motion, seconded by Mr. Viola and unanimously carried by voice vote. Mayor Orgo advised the next Township Committee Meeting is scheduled for June 12, 2019, 7:30 p.m. in Town Hall, and the Township Committee would not be returning this evening to take action.
